



Camping Terms & Conditions

Please see below our terms and conditions for Camping at Cuby GrooveFest (CGF) and useful info regarding your stay. See also Festival Terms & Conditions

ENTRY, SETUP, VEHICLES & PARKING

- Only vehicles which present a valid ticket for the Event may enter the designated festival camping zones.
- Speed limit is 8kn/hr – all WA traffic laws apply.
- Once camps have been set up and the festival has begun there will be no driving or moving cars throughout the event.
- Patrons will be directed to camp in a specific area and must follow all directions given by the CGF staff and volunteers.
- If you are camping in a Tent Only Zone, you will need to keep your car within your site boundary or use parking elsewhere.
- You agree that you will only camp and park within designated areas and as directed by the CGF staff and volunteers. CGF reserves the right to tow-away any vehicle parked outside of the designated camping area. Retrieval of any towed vehicles shall be at the patron's expense.

SECURITY

Please be aware that Security personnel will be patrolling ticketed events and camping areas over the duration of the festival.

WHAT TO BRING ALONG

You are required to bring everything that you need to be comfortable over the duration of your stay. Some of the items that we recommend bringing along are listed below:

- Warm clothes – it can get very cold at night, pack thermals if you need
- Rain jacket (we're hoping it will be a sunny Sept weekend, but you never know!)
- Closed-in footwear – consider boots or water-resistant footwear
- Sleeping bag / doonas – plus warm rugs as it can get chilly at night
- Pillows
- Sunscreen
- Bug Spray
- Toilet paper (for backup)



- Rubbish Bags
- Drinking Water (allow minimum 2L per day per person) – we provide free water great for refills, but it helps to have a backup
- Food & Snacks – refreshments will be available but not open 24/7
- Esky / Cooler with Ice (block ice recommended to last the weekend)
- Torch / Head Torch
- Camping chairs
- Shade for camp
- Medications / Pain Killers
- Basic First Aid Kit
- Earplugs (personal preference)
- Chocks for your vehicle/trailers
- Your own Bush Doof Stick – we love a laugh and you might WIN a prize!

WHAT NOT TO BRING ALONG

Please use your noggin when deciding what to bring to the festival. Your vehicle may be searched on entry and any prohibited items will be confiscated and will need to be collected at the end of the event. If we find anything illegal or what we believe may cause harm to others, you will be referred to the Police.

The following items are prohibited at the CGF:

- Illicit drugs
- Weapons (of any sort)
- Drug paraphernalia
- Any Glass – we are a glass free event
- Fireworks / Explosives
- Open flame gas cookers
- Burn barrels & firewood

WEATHER CONDITIONS

Being held in spring, the weather can be unpredictable. Check the weather conditions before you come and pack accordingly.

Cuballing and surrounds can experience cold temperatures at night, so bring extra layers and spare clothing in case anything gets wet/damp. Bring extra doonas or rugs to keep you snug at night.



CAMPING ZONES

There are designated camping zones which you will be directed to on arrival based on your ticket selection. We ask that you follow the instructions of the CGF staff and volunteers, as they direct you to your camping area.



NEIGHBOURLY CONDUCT

Please be mindful of others when setting up your camp. Be prepared for others to camp close to you, be friendly and you will most likely find some festy besties!



VEHICLE SAFETY

Vehicles may be required to be parked in specific ways at your campsite for safety reasons. Wheel chocks are highly recommended for additional safety precautions.

PATHWAYS & ROADS

All camping must be within the designated areas. The internal and external traffic systems cannot be blocked or obstructed at any time. Your vehicle may be removed at your cost if found to be causing an obstruction.

GROUP CAMPING

We appreciate that people like to camp with their friends and family. Please ensure that you arrive as a group if you would like to be allocated adjacent camping site (subject to availability). Not everyone will be able to arrive at the same time so you may be directed to a different area if spaces have filled up.

RV's, CARAVANS & CAMPER TRAILERS

These vehicles are permitted in some camping zones – see above. However, there are no grey water dumping facilities and campsites are unpowered. Please check that the combined length of your vehicle and trailer will fit the allocated camping space of 10m X 12m.

GENERATORS

Generators are not permitted in the camping area. Camping will be tight, and generators will be disruptive to your neighbours, due to noise and fumes.

BYO FOOD

You are permitted to bring your own food to the festival. We will have quality regional food vendors at the festival providing a variety of options and catering for most dietary requirements. Due to safety concerns we will not be allowing open flame cookers in the camping area. These may be confiscated.

We encourage you to come stocked with enough dry food and snacks to sustain yourself throughout the event. We recommend nut bars, sandwiches, wraps, cheese platters, fresh fruit, crackers etc.

PETS

We love our furry friends as much as you do, but unfortunately this is a pet-free event. Assistance dogs are permitted.



ALCOHOL

We ask that all attendees are sensible with alcohol consumption. Drive safe and do not drive under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol. Plan your journey, assure you are well rested before driving or arrange a designated driver. Abstain from drinking alcohol during the day/night before you drive home.

GLASS

Our festival has a NO GLASS policy. There will be no glass allowed to enter the festival site. This is to avoid broken glass and to respect the land and grounds.

NOISE

No excessive noise after midnight.

FIRE

In the interest of public safety you will not be permitted to make your own fires. Burn barrels and firewood found by event staff will be confiscated. Anyone found lighting fires will be ejected from the event and may be referred to police should CGF staff deem necessary.

ACCESSIBILITY

There are accessible toilets available. Camping areas do not have sealed pathways. We encourage all patrons with accessibility requirements to contact us pre-event on cdo@cuballing.wa.gov.au to confirm camping site suitability.

AMENITIES

Dryandra Equestrian Centre has toilets and showers for campers. Alternatively, there are toilets and a shower at the Cuballing Recreation Reserve. Portable amenities will also be available at locations over the weekend.

LEAVE NO TRACE

CGF is committed to respecting our natural environment. Please ensure you take everything you came with and leave things as you found them. You agree to recycle rubbish and be water efficient during the festival.
